From the bottom of my heart—thank you. It's because of your unwavering support, encouragement, and generosity that we're able to do what we do each day: create a safe, sober high school environment where teens in recovery can heal, grow, and thrive.

This past year, we had the privilege of walking alongside 42 students and their families. Since opening our doors in 2019, 52% of students served have celebrated one year or more of continuous sobriety while working their recovery plans. These moments aren't just statistics—they are transformations made possible by our supportive community.

As we celebrate our sixth year, we've reached new milestones. But even with these wins, we know our work is far from finished. There are countless teens and families in the Charlotte area still struggling and many don't even know that help exists.

That's why this year we're making marketing and outreach a top priority.

One of the most powerful takeaways from our recent community events has been this: Show up. Speak up. Keep the conversation going. There are adolescents silently battling substance use and mental health challenges who need to hear that they're not alone—that there's a safe, supportive place for them to heal and learn.







STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS



The best part is they meet you where you are so you're not alone.



Holistic Support:

- Personalized Support Plan: We'll create an individualized plan that outlines your personal goals for recovery.
- Dedicated Recovery Staff: Recovery Support Staff available throughout the day to offer guidance and support.
- Regular Check-Ins: Meet one-on-one every three weeks to discuss progress and collaboratively set new goals.
- Supportive Community: Morning and afternoon recovery groups provide a safe space to connect and learn from each other.
- Open Communication: Collaborating with families and external support providers to create a strong support network.

Return to Use by Type of School Environment:






At Emerald School of Excellence, we understand that the cost of recovery and education can be a significant concern. We believe that financial

limitations should not prevent deserving students from pursuing their recovery journey and academic goals. To ensure that finances do not serve as a barrier for potential families, we strive to provide financial aid to over 24% of our students each academic year, the national average for all private schools. Since we opened our doors in 2019, we have not had to turn

a single family away due to financial need.

Our Scholarship Fund removes barriers for potential families in need, allowing more teens access to a Recovery High School education. The generous support of our Scholarship Fund provided twenty six students with financial assistance this past school year, seven of whom received a full scholarship.




% of Students Receiving Aid % of Students on Full Scholarships


COST-BENEFIT OF A RECOVERY HIGH SCHOOL

Educating a student at Emerald School of Excellence costs about twice as much as in a traditional public school—but only a fraction of the cost of juvenile incarceration or emergency care for an overdose. By helping teens avoid both, Recovery High Schools (RHS) like Emerald School of Excellence not only change lives but also save taxpayers significant dollars.

By helping 57 students reach a year or more of continuous sobriety, Emerald School of Excellence may have saved our state over \$5 million in emergency room visit costs alone. As enrollment continues to grow, Emerald School of Excellence can continue to save taxpayer dollars.

Supporting Recovery High Schools like Emerald not only gives teens the tools to recover and graduate, it also saves taxpayers significant resources turning potential tragedy into hope and a brighter future.

FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

2024 Income:

Emerald School of Excellence is funded in part through tuition, which is determined on a sliding scale based on each family's financial need. Most families receive aid to cover some or all of the cost.

Because tuition covers only a portion of our annual expenses, we depend on the generosity of donors and the support of grants to bridge the gap and ensure every student has access to the education and recovery support they deserve.




